



Urban Jungle Hat

Whether you are maneuvering through a city or spending your time in the country, this hat is perfect for keeping you warm. Knit in the round on circular needles, it won't take much time to transform this super bulky yarn into your new cozy hat!

To Fit Head Circumference: 20".

RED HEART® "Light & Lofty®": 1 skein 9931 Rainforest Multi.

RED HEART® "Super Saver®": 1 skein 303 Painted Desert Print.

Circular Knitting Needles: 12.75 [US 17] 24" long.
Stitch marker, yarn needle.

GAUGE: 7 sts = 4"; 12 rows = 4" in St st with 1 strand of each yarn held tog. **CHECK YOUR GAUGE. Use any size needle to obtain the gauge.**

Special Abbreviation

M1 (make one stitch) = Lift running thread before next stitch onto left needle and knit into the back loop.

HAT

With 1 strand of each yarn held together, cast on 36 sts.

Row 1: * P2, k2; repeat from * to end of row.

Repeat Row 1 once more.

Join

Place marker for beginning of round and join, being careful not to twist sts. Work 3 rounds in P2, k2 rib as established.

Next Round (Inc): * K6, m1; repeat from * around—42 sts.

Work even in St st (knit every round) until piece measures 4" from beginning. Cut Light and Lofty and continue in Super Saver only. Work even until piece measures 10" from beginning.

Shape Crown

Round 1: [K2, k2tog] 10 times, k2—32 sts.

Round 2: Knit even around.

Round 3: [K2tog]16 times—16 sts.

FINISHING

Cut yarn leaving long tail. Thread tail through remaining sts and pull tightly to secure. Sew 2 rows at lower edge together. Weave in yarn ends.



SUPER BULKY

RED HEART® "Light & Lofty®", Art. E708 available in solid color 6 oz (170 g), 140 yd (128 m) and multi color and stripes 4.5 oz (127 g), 105 yd (96 m) skeins.



MEDIUM

RED HEART® "Super Saver®" Art. E300 available in solid color 7 oz (198 g), 364 yd (333 m); multi color, heather and print 5 oz (141 g), 244 yd (223 m), flecks 5 oz (141g), 260 yds (238 m) skeins.

Abbreviations: **K** = knit; **mm** = millimeters; **p** = purl; **st(s)** = stitch(es); **St st** = Stockinette stitch; **tog** = together; **[]** = work directions in brackets the number of times specified; *** or **** = repeat whatever follows the * or ** as indicated.



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
