What you will need:

RED HEART® Super Saver®:
1 skein each 0334 Buff A, 0706 Perfect Pink B, 0512 Turqua C, 0321 Gold D, 0312 Black E, 0311 White F, 0310 Cherry Red G

Susan Bates® Crochet Hook: 5mm [US H-8]

Susan Bates® Knitting Needles: 4.5mm [US 7]

Yarn needle, stitch marker, fiberfill

CROCHET GAUGE: 14 sts = 4" (10 cm); 15 rows = 4" (10 cm) in single crochet. **CHECK YOUR GAUGE.** Use any size hook to obtain the gauge.

KNIT GAUGE: 16 sts = 4" (10 cm); 24 rows = 4" (10 cm) in Stockinette st (knit on Right Side, purl on Wrong Side). **CHECK YOUR GAUGE.** Use any size needles to obtain the gauge.

Gnoella & Gnoah Gnome Twins

The blessed event has happened! Join Gnorbert and Gnora in welcoming the additions to their family! Baby Gnoella is crochet and Baby Gnoah is knit.

For parents patterns please see LW2599 Gnorbert Gnome and LW2781 Gnora Gnome.

Each gnome measures 7" (18 cm) tall, seated.

Special Crochet Stitches

3-hdc popcorn = 3 hdc in indicated stitch, remove hook from loop, insert hook from front to back in first hdc of 3-hdc group, place dropped loop back on hook and draw through.
sc2tog = [Draw up a loop in next st] twice, yarn over and draw through all 3 loops on hook.

Special Knit Stitches

Inc 1 to 5 = Work 5 stitches into one stitch – Knit into front of next st without removing from needle, then knit into back, front, back, and front again of same st.
M1 = Make 1 (Increase) – Lift strand between needles to left-hand needle and knit strand through the back loop, twisting it to prevent a hole.

Special Crochet Technique

Adjustable Ring = Holding the yarn a few inches from the end, wrap around your finger. Do not remove wrap from finger, insert hook into the wrap and draw up a loop of working yarn. Chain one to secure the loop, and remove ring from finger. Work stitches of first round in the ring. Pull gently, but firmly, on tail to tighten ring.

Notes

- Colors **A, B, D, E, F,** and **G** are needed for Gnoella. **A, C, D, E,** and **G** are needed for Gnoah.
- Gnoella is crocheted, and Gnoah is knit. Only small amounts of each color are needed. Many gnomes can be made from 1 skein of each color.
- Head and body are made in one piece. Then arms and legs are worked separately and sewn to body. Bonnet, cap, diaper, and hair are worked separately and attached to finished gnome.
- Stuff pieces lightly. Do not over stuff.

5. Gauge is not critical. Work tightly to ensure that stuffing does not show through stitches.

GNOELLA

Head

- Beginning at top of head, with **A**, make an adjustable ring.
- Round 1 (Right Side):** Work 6 sc in ring; do not join, work in continuous rounds—6 sc. Place marker for beginning of round. Move marker up as work progresses.
- Round 2:** Work 2 sc in each sc around—12 sc.
- Round 3:** [Sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc] 6 times—18 sc.
- Round 4:** [Sc in next 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 6 times—24 sc.
- Rounds 5–7:** Sc in each sc around.
- Round 8:** Sc in next 5 sc, 3-hdc popcorn (for ear), sc in next 5 sc, 3-hdc popcorn (for nose), sc in next 5 sc, 3-hdc popcorn (for ear), sc in last 6 sc.
- Round 9 and 10:** Sc in each sc around.
- Round 11:** [Sc in next 2 sc, sc2tog] 6 times—18 sc.
- Round 12:** [Sc in next sc, sc2tog] 6 times—12 sc. Do not fasten off.
- Embroider Face:** With **E**, embroider 2 French Knots on either side of nose. Cut a length of **E** and separate the plies. Using a single ply of **E**, embroider 3 eyelashes at the corner of each eye. With **G**, embroider a straight st mouth below the nose.
- Round 13:** [Sc in next 2 sc, sc2tog] 3 times—9 sc. Stuff head.
- Body**
- Round 14:** Work 2 sc in each sc around—18 sc.
- Round 15:** [Sc in next 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 6 times—24 sc.
- Rounds 16–21:** Sc in each sc around.

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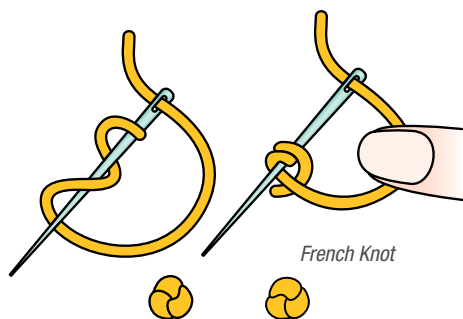
Round 22: [Sc in next 2 sc, sc2tog] 6 times—18 sc.

Stuff body.

Round 23: [Sc in next sc, sc2tog] 6 times—12 sc.

Round 24: [Sc2tog] 6 times—6 sc.

Fasten off, leaving a long tail. Weave tail through remaining stitches and pull to gather. Securely weave in end.



Legs (make 2)

Beginning at foot, with **A**, make an adjustable ring.

Round 1 (Right Side): Work 8 sc in ring; do not join, work in continuous rounds—8 sc. Place marker for beginning of round. Move marker up as work progresses.

Round 2: Sc in each sc around.

Round 3: [Sc2tog, sc in next sc] 2 times, sc2tog—5 sc.

Round 4: Sc in each sc around.

Round 5: [Sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc] 2 times, sc in last sc—7 sc.

Round 6: Sc in each sc around, TURN.

Note: Work now proceeds back and forth in rows, leaving one stitch unworked at the end of each row. This creates a bend in the leg.

Row 7 (Wrong Side): Ch 1, sc in first 6 sc, turn; leave last sc unworked—6 sc.

Row 8: Ch 1, sc in first 5 sc, turn; leave last sc unworked—5 sc.

Row 9: Ch 1, sc in first 4 sc, turn; leave last sc unworked—4 sc.

Notes: Work now resumes in the round. Work into every stitch as instructed, including the stitches that were left unworked when working the leg bend. To help the leg bend and reduce gaps between stitches, a sc2tog is worked when each of the unworked stitches is worked into. Each sc2tog is worked by drawing up a loop in the edge of a row and in the unworked stitch.

Round 10 (Right Side): Ch 1, sc in first 4 sc; do not turn, working down side edge, [insert hook in edge of row and draw up a loop, insert hook in next unworked st in row below and draw up a loop, yarn over and draw through all 3 loops on hook] 2 times, working up opposite side edge, insert hook in edge of row and draw up a loop, insert hook in next unworked st in row above and draw up a loop, yarn over and draw through all 3 loops on hook—7 sts.

Round 11: Insert hook in edge of Round 10 and draw up a loop, insert hook in first st of Round 10 and draw up a loop, yarn over and draw through all 3 loops on hook, sc in next 6 sc. Slip st in next st. Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing leg to body.

Arms (make 2)

Beginning at hand, work same as leg through Round 5—7 sc.

Rounds 6–9: Sc in each sc around.

Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing arm to body.

Diaper

With **B**, ch 21.

Row 1 (Right Side): Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, turn—20 sc.

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn.

Row 3: Ch 1, skip first sc, slip st in next sc, sc2tog, sc in each sc across to last 4 sc, sc2tog, turn; leave last 2 sts unworked—14 sc.

Row 4: Ch 1, sc2tog, sc in each sc across to last 2 sc, sc2tog, turn—12 sc.

Row 5: Ch 1, sc in first sc, [sc2tog, sc in next 2 sc] 2 times, sc2tog, sc in last sc, turn—9 sc.

Row 6: Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn.

Row 7: Ch 1, sc2tog, sc in next 5 sc, sc2tog, turn—7 sc.

Row 8: Ch 1, sc2tog, sc in next 3 sc, sc2tog, turn—5 sc.

Rows 9–14: Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn.

Round 15 (Right Side): Ch 1, slip st in each st across, do not turn, slip st evenly around entire outside edge; join with slip st in first slip st. Fasten off.

Bonnet

Beginning at top of bonnet, with **B**, make an adjustable ring.

Round 1 (Right Side): Work 4 sc in ring; do not join, work in continuous rounds—4 sc. Place marker for beginning of round. Move marker up as work progresses.

Round 2: [Sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc] 2 times—6 sc.

Round 3: [Sc in next 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 2 times—8 sc.

Round 4: [Sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc] 4 times—12 sc.

Round 5: [Sc in next 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 4 times—16 sc.

Round 6: [Sc in next 3 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 4 times—20 sc.

Round 7: [Sc in next 4 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 4 times—24 sc.

Rounds 8 and 9: Sc in each sc around; TURN at the end of Round 9.

Back of Bonnet

Row 10 (Wrong Side): Ch 1, sc2tog, sc in next 12 sc, sc2tog, turn—14 sc.

Row 11: Ch 1, sc2tog, sc in next 10 sc, sc2tog, turn—12 sc.

Row 12: Ch 1, sc2tog, sc in next 8 sc, sc2tog, turn—10 sc.

Row 13: Ch 1, sc2tog, sc in next 6 sc, sc2tog, turn—8 sc.

Row 14: Sc in each sc across, turn. Fasten off.

Lace Trim (Right Side): With Right Side facing and leaving a long tail (for bonnet tie), join **F** with slip st in end of Row 14 to work across front edge of bonnet; *ch 3, sc in front edge; repeat from * working evenly spaced across front edge; slip st in opposite end of Row 14. Fasten off, leaving a long tail (for bonnet tie).

Front Curl

With **D**, ch 5.

Row 1: Slip st in 2nd ch from hook, [ch 2, slip st in next ch] 2 times, slip st in last ch. Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing curl to head.

Finishing (Gnoella)

Using photograph as a guide, stuff arms and legs and sew to body. Legs can be sewn to body in a sitting or standing position, as desired.

Fold diaper, bringing Row 14 up to Row 1 and folding edges of Row 1 over ends of Row 14. With **F**, sew a cross stitch at each end of Row 1 to hold top of sides of diaper together. Place diaper on gnome.

Place bonnet on gnome's head. With bonnet in place, determine location for front curl. Remove bonnet and sew front curl to head. Replace bonnet and tie a bow at chin. If desired, bonnet can be sewn to head with a few stitches. Weave in all ends.

GNOAH

Head and Body

Beginning at top of head, with **A**, cast on 8 sts.

Row 1 (Wrong Side): Purl.

Row 2: K1, [M1, k1] 7 times—15 sts.

Row 3: Purl.

Row 4: K1, [M1, k2] 7 times—22 sts.

Row 5: Purl.

Row 6: K2, [M1, k3] 6 times, M1, k2—29 sts.

Rows 7–11: Work in St st (knit on Right Side, purl on Wrong Side) for 5 rows.

Row 12: K7, increase 1 to 5 (for ear), k6, increase 1 to 5 (for nose), k6, increase 1 to 5 (for ear), k7—41 sts.

Row 13: P7, p5tog, p6, p5tog, p6, p5tog, p7—29 sts.

Row 14: Knit.

Row 15: Purl.

Row 16: [K2, k2tog] 7 times, k1—22 sts.

Row 17: Purl.

Row 18: [K1, k2tog] 7 times, k1—15 sts.

Row 19: Purl.

Row 20: [K1, k2tog] 5 times—10 sts.

Embroider Face: With **E**, embroider 2

French Knots on either side of nose. With **G**, embroider a straight st mouth below the nose.

Body

Row 21: Purl.

Row 22: [K1, M1] 9 times, k1—19 sts.

Row 23: Purl.

Row 24: [K2, M1] 9 times, k1—28 sts.

Row 25: Purl.

Row 26: K14, M1, k14—29 sts.

Rows 27–37: Work in St st for 11 rows.

Row 38: [K2, k2tog] 7 times, k1—22 sts.

Row 39: Purl.

Row 40: [K1, k2tog] 7 times, k1—15 sts.

Row 41: Purl.

Row 42: [K2tog] 7 times, k1—8 sts.

Cut yarn, leaving a long tail. Thread tail through sts of last row and pull to gather. Use remaining tail to sew back seam. Stuff head and body before completing seam.

Arms (make 2)

Beginning at hand, leaving a long beginning tail, with **A**, cast on 5 sts.

Row 1 (Wrong Side): Purl.

Row 2: [K1, M1] 4 times, k1—9 sts.

Rows 3–5: Work in St st for 3 rows.

Row 6: [K1, k2tog] 3 times—6 sts.

Row 7: Purl.

Row 8: [K2, M1] 2 times, k2—8 sts.

Row 9: Purl.

Row 10: K3, M1, k2, M1, k3—10 sts.

Rows 11–16: Work in St st for 6 rows.

Bind off. Cut yarn leaving a long tail. Weave beginning tail through cast-on sts and pull to gather. Securely weave in beginning tail. Use ending tail to sew side seam.

Legs (make 2)

Beginning at foot, work same as arm through Row 10—10 sts.

Row 11: Purl.

Note: Work now proceeds in short rows, leaving one stitch unworked at the end of each row. This creates a bend in the leg.

Row 12: K9, turn; leave last st unworked.

Row 13: P8, turn.

Row 14: K7, turn.

Row 15: P6, turn.

Row 16: Knit to end of row—10 sts.

Rows 17–20: Work in St st for 4 rows.

Bind off. Bind off. Cut yarn leaving a long tail. Weave beginning tail through cast-on sts and pull to gather. Securely weave in beginning tail. Use ending tail to sew side seam.

Diaper

With **C**, cast on 24.

Row 1 (Wrong Side): Purl.

Row 2: Knit.

Row 3: Purl.

Row 4: Bind off 2 sts, k2tog, knit to end of row—21 sts.

Row 5: Bind off 2 sts, p2tog, purl to end of row—18 sts.

Row 6: [K2tog] 2 times, knit to last 4 sts, [k2tog] 2 times—14 sts.

Row 7: Purl.

Row 8: K2tog, k4, k2tog, k4, k2tog—11 sts.

Row 9: Purl.

Row 10: K2tog, knit to last 2 sts, k2tog—9 sts.

Row 11: Purl.

Row 12: K2tog, knit to last 2 sts, k2tog—7 sts.

Rows 13–21: Work in St st for 9 rows.

Row 22: K1, M1, knit to last st, M1, k1—9 sts.

Row 23: Purl.

Row 24: Knit.

Bind off.

Cap

Beginning at tip of cap, leaving a long beginning tail, with **A**, cast on 4 sts.

Row 1 (Wrong Side): Purl.

Row 2: [K1, M1] 3 times, k1—7 sts.

Row 3: Purl.

Row 4: [K2, M1] 3 times, k1—10 sts.

Row 5: Purl.

Row 6: [K3, M1] 3 times, k1—13 sts.

Row 7: Purl.

Row 8: [K2, M1] 6 times, k1—19 sts.

Row 9: Purl.

Row 10: [K3, M1] 6 times, k1—25 sts.

Row 11: Purl.

Row 12: [K4, M1] 6 times, k1—31 sts.

Rows 13–18: Work in St st for 6 rows.

Bind off.

Front Curl

With **E**, cast on 10 sts. Work no rows, bind off immediately. Fasten off, leaving a long tail.

Weave the tail through the bound-off edge and pull to form a curve. Secure end, but do not trim tail. Use tail later to sew curl to head. Bind off.

Belt

With **E**, cast on 40 sts. Work no rows, bind off immediately.

Finishing (Gnoah)

Using photograph as a guide, stuff arms and legs and sew to body. Legs can be sewn to body in a sitting or standing position, as desired.

Fold diaper, bringing bind-off edge up to cast-on edge and folding edges of cast-on edge over ends of bind-off edge. With **C**, sew a cross stitch at each end of cast-on edge to hold top of sides of diaper together. Place diaper on gnome. Wrap belt around top of diaper, allowing ends to overlap at front. With **E**, sew belt to diaper. With **D**, embroider straight st belt buckle on belt.

Place cap on gnome's head. With cap in place, determine location for front curl. Remove cap and sew front curl to head. Replace cap and sew to head. Weave in all ends.

ch = chain; **hdc** = half double crochet; **k** = knit; **k2tog** = knit 2 stitches together; **p** = purl; **p2tog** = purl 2 stitches together; **p5tog** = purl 5 stitches together; **sc** = single crochet; **st(s)** = stitch(es); **St st** = Stockinette stitch; **[]** = work directions in brackets the number of times specified; ***** = repeat whatever follows the * as indicated.



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
